The theme was French food and at the end of the session the children got to sample different French foods such as croissants and pain au chocolate and hot chocolate. Visit from Cain and Helen



We were really lucky to be able to invite some very special guests into school on Monday. Cain is 21 years old and he has cerebral palsy. He came into school with his carer Helen to speak to us all. We watched a video of a typical day for Cain. Because he is in a wheelchair he has to make sure that he keeps his muscles moving so he has daily

physiotherapy and hydrotherapy in the pool.

Cain can play on his play station and he uses his feet to work the controller. The children all had a go at writing with their feet to see how tricky this was.

The one thing that Helen says upsets Cain – who is normally really happy and has the most amazing infectious laugh – is when people stare at him, in



particular when he is eating. He is unable to feed himself and Helen feeds him. He does not like it when people stare at him and Helen sometimes has to stand in front of him to block people which is not very nice for Cain which he is eating.



To get an idea of what it was like to not be able to feed yourself, the teachers were fed a yoghurt by a couple of the children. They had the sit on their hands and were not able to speak. It was a strange experience not having any control.



After this some of the children had a go at putting on a top with one hand behind their back to think about how tricky this is for Cain. It was certainly difficult to get the top on only using one hand!

Stan told me 'I found it really interesting how Cain uses his computer, he looks at the words on the screen and then the computer says them. It must be really hard not being able to communicate the way that most of us do not being able to do some of the things other people can. Helen told us that when Cain was born his brain was without oxygen for a while and because of this the messages don't get through from his brain to his muscles.'

Please let us know about any of your child's achievements outside of school and we can add them to our achievement board!


