# Curriculum:

# Science- Years 5 and 6.

In their science lessons years 5 and 6 have been filtering dirty water to try and make it cleaner.



Seren explained that the cut a bottle in half and added filter paper and cotton wool. The cotton wool was to collect the particles as well as the filter paper. She said that the slower the process the more effective it was and the cleaner the water

Lily said that the more layers there were, the cleaner the water became and there was gravel and mud left in the filter paper because the particles could not pass through.



# Art this term



Class River have been exploring the artwork of Pablo Picasso this term. They first explored a timeline of art history – picking their most and least favourite styles. After creating collages and colour blocked Picasso replicas they painted their own portraits in his cubism style and even painted each other!





Class Estuary have been creating Egyptian Artwork this term. They have; created pharaoh portraits in oil pastel and digitally; built sarcophaguses out of clay and Modroc; and built 3D Giza pyramid scenes carefully including highlight, shade and shadow.





Class Ocean have been creating artwork influenced by Roman culture this term. Inspired by Roman architecture, they have created natural and ceramic mosaics. They have also explored light and shade creating charcoal and chalk columns.
