#### WRAPAROUND CARE

Following requests and feedback from our school community we identified a need for wraparound care here at Huntley Primary School. We spent months behind the scenes looking at options to put this in place and eventually managed to find a solution that would provide a breakfast club and after school care. This term we are trialling the provision we have put in place to ensure that it works for everyone and can be run alongside school in a cost efficient manner.

Sadly the uptake for breakfast club has been so low that we have been unable to cover running costs and we have had to admit defeat. So breakfast club will run up until the last day of term but will not be running when we return in to school in November.

Numbers for after school clubs have been gradually increasing so we will continue running this after half term and review again nearer to Christmas. If you would like to book a place for your

As governors, our core functions are:

- To ensure there is clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction for the school
- Hold the head teacher and her team to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils and the performance management of staff

• Oversee financial performance, making sure the budget is well spent

We fulfil our role by working together, sharing our knowledge and experiences through a number of committees – currently we have 4 committees at Huntley:

- Finance and staffing
- Quality of Education
- Ethos
- Facilities

Each committee meets termly with the outcomes from these meetings feeding into the full governing meetings which also meet on a termly basis.

We work with the head teacher to develop the School Improvement Plan (SIP) which identifies the priorities for the coming year. The governors then have a responsibility for monitoring this plan through a range of activities such as the meetings mentioned above. Governors are allocated an area of responsibility from the curriculum or SIP, depending on their particular interest or area of expertise and are encouraged to visit school to familiarise themselves with and monitor this area.

Whilst it may appear to be an onerous task, the role of the governing body is a rewarding one. We work together sharing knowledge and drawing on each other's expertise. Training is available for both new and experienced governors to ensure we are kept up to date with latest requirements and there is nothing more rewarding watching our children learn and grow.
