This term we were incredibly honoured to meet gold medal winning Paralympian, Andy Lewis!

Andy spent a whole day with us and each class got to spend time with him as well as a whole school assembly. Class River have told us a little bit about Andys visit:

Class River have been learning about the history of sports tournaments in topic, going back as far as the first recorded Olympic games to the beginning of the Paralympics. Andy is a gold medal winning paralympic triathlete. It was really interesting to hear about his experiences and journey to winning gold at the Paralympics in Rio de Janeiro in 2016. We even got to hold his gold medal! He explained how the medal has silver balls in that rattle. This helps people who are visually impaired recognise the medals. 4 We also got to experience some paralympic sports! Andy took us out onto the playground, paired us up and put blindfolds on one of us! One person became the athlete and the other person was their guide. We learnt that communication is so important between a visually impaired athlete and their guide. We also learnt that it is really important that we work as a team, no matter what we do! Thank you, Andy for a really inspiring and fun visit!



#### SKILLZONE


